

## Ball Pit Party

**Objective:** The Ball Pit Party game is all about having fun and engaging in a variety of playful activities within a ball pit. The goal is to keep children entertained and active through different games and challenges involving the ball pit.

### Setup:

- **Ball Pit:** Set up multiple ball pits using pits provided
- **Space:** Ensure the ball pit is in a safe, open indoor space.
- **Props:** Gather additional props like small toys, beach balls, or soft items to add to the ball pit for extra fun.

### Rules:

6. **Ball Pit Simon Says:** Play a game of Simon Says with actions that involve the ball pit, such as “Simon says, sit down in the ball pit,” or “Simon says, throw a ball in the air.”

### Game Flow:

1. **Initial Introduction:** Gather the children and explain the ball pit setup and rules.
2. **Activity Rotation:** Start with free play to let children get accustomed to the ball pit, then introduce different activities one by one.

3. **Supervision:** Ensure constant supervision to maintain safety and encourage fair play.
4. **End with Free Play:** Finish with another session of free play or let children choose their favorite activities to repeat.
